1) SH – update on Post Office; Open Day

A substantial number attended the Open Day on 21st October and we received many stimulating comments and ideas, as well as donations. Snooks Corner Community Group donated a share of the winding up process after they decided to reform the group into a social. Anne Netley suggested a flyer posted far and wide to list everything needed and the importance of continued donations – a really good idea taken up enthusiastically by SH, EL & MH.

2) JB – update on Blakes Cottage.

Lizzie received a query from Blake's Cottage Trust to FHG by Andy Bliss, who asked if we had any info on the history of the cottage. RB had researched Frank Jonathan Howell, who was unfortunately killed by an aircraft in Odiham in 1948. He had been a fighter pilot in WWII but captured and imprisoned in the far east. He is buried in St. Mary's churchyard and his address was given as Blake's Cottage. But there was no further info about the cottage itself, when it was built etc.

3) WW11 History Group project

MB presented documents, magazines, books from the period, all readily available, to show how much material it was easy to access, to encourage others to investigate what life was like on the home front during and after WWII. This stimulated individual memories of rationing etc. from certain members and JT recalled playing amidst bomb sites, awful food and polluted soil where it was impossible to grow anything. JT and he offered to help MB in exploring this aspect of life; diet, rationing, recipes etc. How did families cope at that time? Thanks to MB for her initiative, which showed how much fun can be had from relatively straightforward research, and really helped coalesce thoughts about how to proceed.

4) How do we plan to cover the cost of future projects?

MH – should we introduce a subscription charge or seek funding from FVCS on a case-by-case basis? Should we continue as we are (rotating chair is one idea) or establish officers of the group? MH asked to request from FVCS what our group budget is. Could we even ring fence our subscriptions to be used specifically for the FNG?
